

## The Power of the Gospel

Romans 1:1-32 / Sermon Notes

**THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE:** Have you ever felt powerless?



## THE POINT

The gospel is the solution to the problem of sin.

## WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY?

- ► The Greeting: Paul introduces the \_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus Christ.
  - Promised (v. 1) Everything in the gospel orbits around the person of Jesus Christ.
  - Grace (v. 5) The gospel has real significant impact in the lives of individuals.
- ► The Goal: Paul intercedes for the \_\_\_\_\_ of the saints.
  - Ceasing (v. 9) The prosperity of their faith was a direct result of continuous prayer.
  - Established (v. 11) The church benefits from giving and receiving of spiritual blessings.
- ► The Gospel: Paul insists \_\_\_\_\_ is available to all by faith.
  - Power (v. 16) Rome was the seat of power, called the "cesspool of iniquity". Powerless to become righteous.
  - Righteousness (17) The idea is not condemning a guilty sinner but converting a filthy sinner.

"God will not withhold salvation from anyone who places their trust in Jesus."

- ► The Guilty: Paul illustrates the \_\_\_\_\_ of sin.
  - Wrath (v. 18) The simple & sobering truth is that humanity deserves God's wrath.
  - Ungodliness (v. 18) "idolatry, perversion, wickedness, evil". Necessity for salvation.
  - Penalty (v. 27) A habitual lifestyle of sin carries with it self-destructive results.
